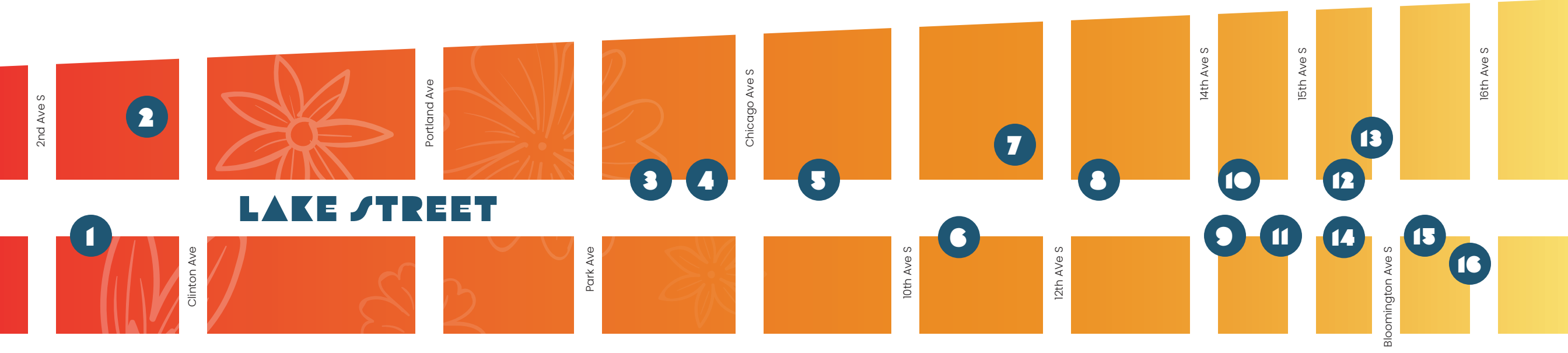


We believe that placemaking projects – like murals – create a sense of belonging and strong ties to a place that encourage economic activity for the many small businesses along the Lake Street corridor.

Our goal is to uplift the many businesses that provide critical services, cultural amenities, and economic activity by mobilizing the unique assets of artists and community members.

There are over 30 murals between 35W and Hiawatha Ave. This map represents only a handful of them and only a small fraction of all of the public art on Lake Street.
